Throughout the past 10 years, AWT has endeavored to serve Arab women, purposefully choosing ways that best suit their style of learning and retaining information. For some, oral learning is best, while others prefer written or visual styles. We have had great opportunity this year to be more available, matching means of communication to the needs. It's not an easy task; it requires passion, commitment, and most importantly, knowing how to recognize and understand the needs of women. By using the right combination of communication and learning styles through our media and training tools, we have been able to equip women to bring change in their lives.

Earlier this year we visited women in their homelands, such as Egypt and Syria. It made a big difference for us to actually observe their needs, becoming personally moved in our hearts by their stories. Listening to the needs of these women has enabled us to better understand their situation. rather than simply listening to the reports of a few. These women amazed us with their perseverance and resilience. They have motivated us to keep them on our agenda and to continue to tackle their issues in our activities.

This annual report highlights our successes in bringing about spiritual and social change, as well as the tangible results we have achieved in partnership with women we serve in the broader Arab region. Radio Program

Our weekly 15-minute radio program delivers powerful and inspiring teaching to Arab women in the Middle East and North Africa guiding them to see themselves in God's eyes, strengthening them to face everyday challenges and inspiring them to become role models believing that they can lead the change to their situation.

Forty three new topics were broadcast in the format of a drama followed by spiritual message which was based on the beliefs and values of the Christian faith.

Our "Woman Today" radio program was well received and met with success by our listeners especially those who are isolated, deprived of freedom and chained by restrictions and feelings of inferiority. Our messages nourished the hope inside them and helped enlighten their way.

In addition, special articles were posted on the events which concern Arab women such as, International Women's Day, Mother's Day, and Violence against Women.

Local & Regional Training

Women from Jordan, Syria and Egypt had the opportunity to participate in our training and seminars in 2009. Through these training AWT helped women value themselves, discover their potentials and empowered them to positively influence others around them. We also worked on developing their capabilities and skills especially those who are in the field of ministry so that they will have a greater impact on the society. Women were also educated regarding unhealthy issues that are negatively affecting their lives.

In 2009, AWT worked for one week with a team of five people who came from Ohio and Arkansas, USA. We reached the marginalized women in different places in Jordan demonstrated the love of God for them whether by listening, teaching or pampering them.



Network Conference

Under the title "Agree with Excellence", AWT held its sixth annual Network conference in Antalya, Turkey. This conference developed a united network between 37 Arab women leaders from 14 Arab countries. They learned the art of negotiation which helped them in their relationships and in making decisions at home, work and church. They were also equipped with skills needed to motivate other women and to do cooperative work in women ministries.

Sharing experiences, dreams and prayers with women from different countries not only enlightened and inspired the participants, but unique relationships were built as well.

Because not all Jordanian women who used to attend our annual Network in Jordan could join us in Turkey this year, we held a two-day seminar addressing the same topic of negotiation for eleven women leaders from different cities in Jordan.

Women had the chance to apply the negotiation skills in a practical way, solving cases that included business issues, political challenges and relationship disagreements.

(Th. from Egypt):

After attending this Conference, I was able to use the Negotiation skills I have learned with my ministry team. I had an idea of a discipleship program for teenagers and almost all my team members said we can't do it. It needs a lot of work and nearly impossible to be achieved.

I presented to them a working plan and explained to them the benefits that teenagers will get during and after this program and finally they agreed!

The results were wonderful and more than we have expected. We had 15 teenagers attend; they became more devoted for their personal walk with the Lord and in reading the Bible.

Imagine if I gave up on the idea after sharing it with my team! It was not easy at all but with the negotiation skills I have learned we were able to achieve all these amazing results."

This conference taught me many negotiation skills. And because of these skills I was able to work in a private company in the sales department and I am very successful.

Your communication with me before and after the conference was sufficient and very encouraging, it was one of the reasons that made me take a further step in my ministry among women at churches and influence their lives like you did with mine!





















Follow Up

AWT has two categories of follow up:

1. Radio and Website:

This category concerns the correspondence with the radio listeners and website viewers. Measuring the impact is difficult to quantify, but through our consistent and various means of communication with our contacts they were encouraged to share how the program and the website influenced them and made a genuine change in their lives. Hundreds of emails, letters, phone calls and chatting built trust and confidence to share their success stories, needs, struggles, and questions. In return, AWT put all the effort needed to help and support them.

One of the challenges is having contacts write once or few times and stop writing for a long period, therefore; revive letters were sent to contacts who didn't write us for a while.

> Also, special personal note and greeting cards were sent to each one on their birthdays. These gestures motivated them to reconnect and were much appreciated by them.

Success Story

2. Trainees:

This category concerns follow up with local and regional trainees. AWT dedicated extra time this year to follow up with the women who attended our training and the Network conference. Watching the progress, listening to their news, stories and needs made a big difference in their lives. Every week encouraging messages and devotionals were sent and prayers were lifted up for them. Furthermore, AWT provided consultation and resource materials as needed.

Sending special greeting cards on specific occasions is another mean of communication with our trainees. It showed our love and care for all of them.

Amal from Jordan:

Amal is a 24 year old girl, who wrote to AWT website after reading the ministry's flyer which she got from her aunt, who attended a ladies' meeting and prayed with AWT staff during a church visit. Amal visited the ministry's office a few times seeking counseling and encouragement concerning some problems affecting her social life, work, and relationship with God. She was in need for someone to listen to her without condemning her, and to pray for her as well. Some members of AWT staff spent time listening to her problems, praying, and following up with her on weekly basis through phone calls and chatting on skype. Later, Amal decided to repent, give her life to Jesus and accept his transforming love. Changes are taking place in her life at a slow pace due to the environment she lives in, and due to her sensitive job which does not allow her to go to church regularly and associate with other believers. However, recently one of her relatives mentioned during a phone call to AWT staff that "Amal changed a lot in a positive way; she's not the same person anymore". All praise to the Lord who reached to her, opened her heart and created hunger in her soul towards him.

Feedback from trainees:

"I want to thank all of you for each help, prayer and support you offered me. When I attended the first conference I was a broken woman with no hope, no dreams and no strength, but that conference has changed me a lot.

I took many decisions that time. I succeeded the official exams at school and now I am ready to enter the University. I have a company with my husband and I have my own shop. I am serving the Lord at the prison ministry, and with teens at the Sunday school.

The Lord is blessing my life with a lot of His gifts; I am a strong woman now with lots of dreams and great faith. I am what I am because of the AWT Ministries. God bless your ministry and keep going."

Financial Information

Even with the depressed economic situation throughout the world, AWT was blessed to receive generous year-end giving. The total revenue for 2009 was 4% over our budget. This was significantly due to several large gifts received during the last guarter of 2009. In addition, expenses were 15% under budget. As a result, 19% of the revenue was remaining at year-end.

The year-end balance was a blessing as AWT lost one of its biggest donors for 2010. This surplus has allowed us to continue with the work that the Lord has put before us.

Financial Accountability:

Arab Woman Today is accountable to the following:


- 1. CHRISTAR is a mission organization that receives funds for AWT projects and provides donors with receipts. To maintain the highest standard of financial accountability, Christar is a member of the Evangelical Council for Financial Accountability, CrossGlobal Link, The Mission Exchange and the Canadian Council of Christian Charities. They also have a yearly audit conducted by an independent accounting firm. The results of the audit are open and available to all who request them.
- 2. Arab Woman Today has a third party, a certified auditor who examines the financial reports annually. The auditor insures that the bookkeeping, accounting system and internals controls are accurate. Copies of the certified report are available upon request.
- 3. PMU Interlife is a mission organization that receives and grants funds from the Swedish Government and as one of their projects, they are required to analyze, evaluate and measure the financial aspects of AWT.

Local Fundraising:


It was on the 4th of December 2009 when AWT had its first local fundraising event. Ninety people gathered that day to join us in celebrating being On-Air for ten years, and be a part of what is happening in the ministry. After presenting the ministry's activities and future plans, an appeal for the needs was given. Forty two people responded and \$3,402 was donated that day in addition monthly and yearly commitments were pledged for a total of \$7,770.




Percentage of Giving by Location



The email was about our value in God's eyes and how close He is to us. There were many verses from the Bible, I was reading them as if this was the first time I read them in my life!

Something changed in my heart immediately, as if there was darkness because of the sadness in my heart and God filled my heart with overflowing joy which I can't describe with words.

At AWT you might think you are doing something simple like sending an email but you will never know how this simple email can change the mood, the heart and the life of the woman who is reading it.


