One pervasive but rarely discussed type of violence was addressed in the 4th JW session, which was led by Attorney Lubna Dawany. This type of violence Financial Violence is Financial Violence. She explained how the economic disempowerment of the Arab woman has historically played a significant part in her acceptance of violence within her home. Women were encouraged to consider acquiring their own source of income and to discuss with their husbands beforehand their basic need for greater personal resources. They were also given guidance on how to develop a personal financial strategy in order to gain influence in

decision-making. "The Balanced Life" was the topic of our 5th JW workshop for 2014. Each lady had the chance to reflect on her current roles in life. They learned that healthy The Balanced Life roles grow out of the soil of diligent spiritual, physical, mental, and emotional care. One lady shared with the group how she took her friend's advice, applied it to a personal matter and succeeded. Another one asked for a bible for her daughter, to be followed later by her friend who also requested one.

Our relief work continues with a new project that started in July and will continue until December. It involves food and non-food item distribution in conjunction with Social Emotional Workshops (SEW). Specifically, by project completion, we anticipate having served 1000 families monthly with food items and 1000 families over a period of six months with non-food items. In dealing with



the psychological impact resulting from the events in Syria, we For the purpose of continual improvement of our support process, an assessment has been completed on the most recent SEW expect that a total of 400 women will have been ministered to through SEW. sessions. As a result of this assessment, a focus on topics relating to children will be emphasized going forward, in order

to answer the growing concerns of women and children who suffer daily as a result of the Syrian crisis.

Consider the following attendee feedback highlights from our last session: "After attending your session on "Grief Cycle", I forbade my children from watching news at home, as I realized the impact of TV and watching violence." • "I feel that I have to pray... I feel there is another kind of prayer that I ought to say. Please come teach me how to pray as you prayed with me."
