- In partnership with Scottsdale Bible Church, ACCTS held:
- A day of training for its staff, offering them a Trauma Care and Team Building workshop. This specially focused day on the staff was definitely well deserved and a step further in the work that ACCTS has envisioned, as taking care of oneself.



- Onother Trauma care workshop for ACCTS coaches, those who are facilitating the social emotional workshops for Syrian refugees, to equip them with more skills and tools, but also for them to feel refreshed and cared for.

• 16 Days of Advocacy



ACCTS-AWT has been privileged to be part of the National Coalition which has been established with the purpose of constructing a follow-up and evaluation plan for Resolution 1325. This resolution was adopted by the Security Council in 2000 focusing on women, security, and peace in Jordan. As part of membership, our organization is proud to have participated in the 16 days annual international campaign against Gender-Based Violence, focusing on raising awareness on child marriage.

- Strengthening Resilience for Syrian Men & women Refugees
- "I have changed the way I treat my chidlren; when I came back home, I saw my wife and children differently!"

ACCTS has completed a project in Irbid targeting 90 men of the newly arrived refugees, those who left the camps, and those living in Jordan since the start of the civil war. Those who are feeling lonely, suffering from fear and anxiety, and facing Sexual and Gender-Based Violence (SGBV) issues. The program aims to raise awareness on topics such as psychosocial education and SGBV. It is a huge step toward social and community development.

Another project targeted 150 Syrian refugee women settling down in Madaba and the neighboring villages. The Psychosocial and SGBV sessions would bring benefits to the Syrian women who feel abandoned and rejected, suffering from anxiety, and encountering the SGBV issues.
