Brothers and Sisters in Christ, consider this:
During 2014, in the middle of the region where we at
ACCTS-AWT live and serve, the so-called "Arab Spring"
ignited momentous change coupled with widespread
troubles, death and destruction. The resulting radical
Islamic groups have terrorized both Muslims and
Christians, resulting in millions of refugees and internally
displaced persons. The final chapter of 2014 revealed the
evacuation of Mosul in northern Iraq by practically all
Christians; over 250,000 of them left the city in order to
seek refuge in the Kurdish regions of northern Iraq.

Still, despite this sad report, it is by God's grace that ACCTS-AWT has continued to stand firm with the help of outstanding global partners like ZOA International (Netherlands); Tearfund (UK); and World Renew (Canada). Together, we served one-thousand Syrian refugee families (approximately 8000 persons) monthly by providing a variety of essentials, to include food packages, non-food items, and social-emotional support to both ease their sufferings and to act as God's hands in caring for their needs. More details about our 2014 refugee relief efforts can be found in this annual report.

Finally, we believe that after one feeds the mouth, it is then necessary to feed the mind. A lack of education has often been cited as fuel for radical groups who often recruit fighters from among uneducated, unemployed teens and young adults. In 2015, we are seeking ways in which we can demonstrate the encouragement of Christ by addressing the educational needs of the people who we serve in this region. We covet your prayers and continued financial support as we follow God's leading in this endeavor.





Jordan Women Workshops

Women possess an inalienable right to experience love and happiness in their relationships. The gap that exists between the textbook knowledge learned in universities and the skill-sets that are actually needed in the marketplace, along with the fact that we reside in a shame culture, explains the existence of high unemployment rates among women and widespread inequality in pay between men and women in our society. The economic disempowerment of the Arab woman has historically played a significant part in her acceptance of violence within her home.

Jordan Women Workshops (JW) are aimed at raising awareness, embracing positive attitudes and acting decisively.

During 2014, AWT held 7 workshops for 31 women from the society on:

- 1. Gender Equity
 - 2. Kinds of violence
- 3. How to have a balanced life
- 4. How to adopt some freeing life-changing values, such as Dealing with Hurt and Forgiveness



Only 20% of public sector and 17% of private sector workforces are women; only 5% of women own their own businesses; and only 8% of women own property due to inequitable, Islamic inheritance laws.

Healthy roles grow out of the soil of diligent spiritual, physical, mental and emotional care

"Violence & Gender Equity" was the topic of our first two workshops that took place in February and March. Ladies were prompted to reflect on their upbringing in early childhood, also basic healthy foundations were discussed. Besides, a holistic picture of the concept of violence within the family and the community was given to include how it is impacted by local laws.

Attorney at Law, Legal Advisor, and Arbitrator Mrs. Lubna Dawany spoke in our May and June workshops. She shared many little-known facts with the attendees based on their rights in the Jordanian law, also discussed a pervasive type of violence "Financial Violence". Eventually, women were given guidance on how to develop a personal financial strategy in order to gain influence in decision-making.

Jordan Women Workshops encouraged the women to...

- 1. Break the silence in regard to violence through both peaceful means and the use of professional organizations
- 2. Start training their kids to be aware of sexual boundaries
- 3. Benefit from the mistakes of other women
- 4. Consider acquiring their own source of income and discussing with their husbands beforehand their basic need for greater personal resources
- 5. Seek a more balanced healthy life in their roles, self care and lifestyle
 - 6. Examine values and experience life-changing truths
- 7. Request private, on-site consultation

Ladies seeking help and advice are followed up through counseling, either directly after the sessions, or via phone calls and planned meetings. Moreover, the warm and friendly atmosphere helps ladies open up and support each other. Two women requested bibles through our workshops this year.

In 2015

We expect that unbelieving Arab young women from Non-Christian Backgrounds who attend our Jordan Women Workshops will have increased knowledge and awareness about themselves and different life issues, which will help them make better decisions in regard to their lives and motivate them to break the cycle of destructive social practices.

- "I will take care of my husband. I will give him time."

- "I will work on developing my gift of mercy... I'll be more involved in evangelism."



Women are provoked to examine their roles in life

We have seen the completion of our second year in the journey with our potential leaders. These ladies are either untrained women who already occupy leading positions in churches or ones who show potential to take active roles in churches, but lack the needed competencies.

The visual representation of the Nouara Program is a tree shaped like a female. In 2013, upbringing and integrity were the topics to prepare the soil and help nourish the trunk of the tree. As for 2014, we touched the need to tackle the tangled branches, that is, the issues that women must understand about themselves in order to be productive parts of the body of Christ.

We were privileged to watch 15 ladies representing 5 cities in Amman blossom in front of our eyes through the discipleship and personal care demonstrated by the AWT staff.

The third phase of the Nouara Program, occurring in April, addressed relational needs. The guest speaker, Dr. Amani Albert from Egypt, Lecturer of Public Relations and Advertising conducted this highly impactful training. The training offered practical applications that can easily be shared and applied by the ladies in their respective spheres of influence. It covered the following topics:

- 1. Personal image
 - 2. Motivations and the needs behind them
 - 3. Inner needs
 - 4. Art of communication with others
 - 5. Types of characters
- 6. Art of listening
- 7. Body Language

The fourth phase of the Program took place in October and was entitled, "Today Matters." Our team imparted wisdom on how to maintain a balanced life, while our speaker Randa Halaseh helped the ladies with the following concepts/topics:

- 1. "Today can be wonderful!"
- 2. Managing my heart-attitude, my priorities and my health
- 3. Managing my family and thinking
- 4. Managing my relationships
- 5. Managing my personal growth

A special group has been created on Facebook to follow up with these ladies and hold them accountable for the decisions they pledged to pursue. Materials are also being provided for the purpose of empowering them in various aspects of their personal, professional and spiritual lives.

Two special cases are now being given counsel on a private personal level through phone calls and a closed group on WhatsApp.

<u>In 2015</u>

- 1. The untrained, Arab women church leaders from within and outside Amman who are potential church leaders but lack needed competencies for ministry would be discipled through AWT's Nouara Discipleship Program in a way that would empower them to be more proficient and efficient in their homes, societies, and churches
- 2. At least half of these women will grow spiritually, lead other women in community outreach activities, participate in other AWT events, be trained on discipleship topics through AWT radio broadcasts

57 Arab women leaders from 12 different Arab countries attended our tenth Network Conference entitled "A More Balanced Life", which was held in November 2014.

AWT sought to give an opportunity for burdened, consumed servants of God to dig deeper into their inner selves, thereby allowing them to uncover practical ways to achieve more balanced lives.

Our main speaker was Laila Faraj from Egypt, who is a specialist in Human and Social Relations.

The Lord used her to set a plumb line among the servants, by which they were able to test the balance level in their lives from the inside out. To heighten the challenge, financier Odeh Habash, Nutritionist Ruba Musharbash, along with the AWT team addressed other segments in the "Wheel of Life" in order to make the quest for balance even more comprehensive and enjoyable.

- 11. Balance in finances



On the 1st of September, the first season of AWT's new TV program "Balshi min hon" which means, "Start from here" began to be broadcasted on three TV stations: Sat-7 Arabic, Sat-7 Plus and Sat-7 North America. It aims to empower women through biblical leadership skills based on the word of God. Viewers were motivated to start a change in patterns of thinking, habits and ways of communication, and above all to start a change in their life journey by following Jesus.

The first season consists of 13 episodes which were aired and are still being repeated on the above mentioned Sat-7 channels.

Episodes titles are as follows:

- 1. Thinking types
 - 2. Self-motivation
 - 3. Goal-setting
- 4. Decision-making
- 5. Effective communication skills
- 6. Understanding personality types
 - 7. Confrontation and giving feedback
 - 8. Conflict resolution skills
 - 9. Working within a team
 - 10. Effective negotiation skills
- 11. Time-management skills
 - 12. Me and technology
 - 13. Forming and changing habits

Every episode includes some motivational questions, quotes and statements for discussions. The purpose is to motivate the Arab woman to start a change. She needs this since she is living in a culture that mistreats her. In every episode, the viewer has the chance to hear the gospel message and a word of encouragement from the bible, as well as the biblical perspective on each topic.

All episodes of "Balshi min hon" are now on YouTube. Facebook, Twitter and Gmail are the three platforms by which we interact with the viewers.



"SAT-7 is the pioneer of Arabic satellite broadcast stations in the world. It filled the Middle East with

the gospel message when the area lacked any TV ministry. Sat-7 Network broadcasts across 22 countries in the Middle East and North Africa, along with 50 countries in Europe. In 2014, the overall viewing audience of all channels is estimated at over 15 million. It reaches into the homes of a potential audience of 4 million Arab viewers across the USA and Canada."

In 2015

- 1. Views will be recorded for each of the broadcast's episodes via the AWT and/or SAT7 YouTube channels
- 2. Women will seek face-to-face meetings with AWT staff/volunteers after watching the TV broadcasts, in order to develop a closer relationship and to obtain guidance for dealing with personal needs
- 3. Women will seek to engage in private social media conversations after watching the program
- 4. Women in the MENA region who frequent routine. secular locations such as gyms, bookstores, coffee shops and business centers would become aware of AWT's satellite broadcast
- 5. Women groups within churches outside Amman would become aware of the program and become advocates for it

Hope for the Heart is a radio ministry in Texas that publishes biblical counseling materials. As a result of a three-year partnership between ACCTS-AWT and HFTH ministry, along with Ophir publications, the following outcomes were achieved:

- 1. Six volumes from the "Biblical Counseling Keys" series by June Hunt were translated into Arabic and published
- 2. An orientation for pastors from different ministries was conducted by Phillip Prather, former Director of International Ministry- HFTH
- 3. Training for around 50 church leaders was administered by Haley Scully from HFTH
- 4. A total of 124 counseling books were sold

Social media, especially Facebook, is so important for increasing website traffic, developing loyal followers, generating leads, reducing media expenses, and increasing opportunities for reaching out and communicating on a personal level. As a tool in support of outreach ministry, social media offers the potential for touching lives, that has never been available through traditional means, especially with respect to Middle Eastern and North African countries that are closed to the Gospel message.

Through our Facebook page, we aspire to spread female awareness on the physical, psychological and spiritual levels so that a woman can...


- 1. Know herself, that is, what is of benefit for her and what is not
- 2. Break some barriers forming strongholds in her mind, such as feeling inferior or remaining silent about abuse or violence
- 3. Know her value in God's eyes
- 4. Hear a clear presentation of the Gospel of Jesus Christ

During 2014, our Facebook page succeeded in enlightening Arab women about their rights in a balanced way, as it relates to freedoms, faith, and many other aspects of life. Three to four posts were made daily, in addition to the sharing of a piece of biblical wisdom. People's language, concepts and real-life challenges based on Christian values were used to empower Arab women. New media materials were collected, customized and filtered (such as videos, pictures, stories and articles).

In 2014, our Facebook page attracted a good number of fans, exceeding the expectations in the last quarter of the year.

Four people clearly received the salvation message and are now being followed up on a personal level.

A weekly average of 200 likes... 50 comments... 20 shares



Refugee Relief Program

During the year 2014, the Relief Department at ACCTS celebrated its achievements with the help of our donors (World Renew, ZOA and TearFund).

Achievements include:

- O 1. Food Distributions (World Renew)
 Over the course of twelve months, ACCTS managed to distribute 12,000 food packages (1000 per month), and from this total number, 1800 Packages were given to poor Jordanian families with the help of church leaders.
 These distributions were done over a period of one year with an average of 1000 food packages per month.
- 2. Non-Food Item Distribution (ZOA) ZOA's support consisted of non-food item provisions for 2000 families per year (1700 NFI packages for Syrian Refugee families and 300 for poor Jordanians in the form of food coupons). Distributions were also done with the help of church leaders.
- 3. SEW- Psychosocial Workshops (TearFund) These sessions took place with the help of coaches and trainers. They targeted 900 traumatized Syrian women, where each woman attended 6 sessions over three days.

Besides the above main three categories which the Relief Department worked on, some small projects took place alongside them such as the following:

4. ZOA Winterization Program
 Heaters, jerrycans and fuel coupons were distributed to
 300 Syrian Refugee families.

5. TearFund Winterization

TearFund distributed 350 heaters, jerrycans, fuel coupons and blankets for the 2014 winter.

6. TearFund 200 NFI

TearFund, during their visit to our office in Jordan, decided to provide an extra 200 NFI Packages for the Syrian refugee families, and to copy the work we are already doing with ZOA.

- 7. Six (6) training sessions were conducted for the volunteers and church members working with our program.
- 8. Special training for online registration among all our distribution points was done, in order to minimize double work and effort, and improve work efficiency.
- 9. Nine (9) coaches attended AWT's Annual Network Conference training in November, besides another special training for 2 coaches that took place in December. Such trainings aimed at enhancing the quality of work the coaches are performing in psychosocial workshops.

In 2015

- 1. Through our partnership with ZOA, TearFund and World Renew, food distributions will be done over a period of 3 months with an average of 500 food packages per month. And non-Food distribution will be made over a period of 6 months
- 2. Syrians will benefit from our Medical Outreach to the Syrians with the help of our partners from New Life Providence Church, Virginia
- 3. The Syrian children will be blessed through our "Back to School Project"

SEW - Psychosocial Workshops

The majority of Syrian refugees in Jordan are mothers with kids; most of their spouses were either killed or are still fighting in Syria. Mothers are struggling with raising their children and being single parents, sometimes with as many as 5-10 children in one family. Through our ministry, women shared their heart cry regarding the change they have been witnessing in their children's characters after war. Evident increases in violence were tangible among family members, especially between brothers-sisters and mothers-children. Being motivated by the need and for the purpose of continual improvement of our support process, an assessment has been completed on previous SEW sessions. Consequently, a focus on topics relating to children and war was emphasized during 2014, in order to answer the growing concerns of women and children who suffer daily as a result of the Syrian crisis.

Communicated teaching through the sessions:

- 1. Dealing with Grief
- The grief cycle
- The emotional cup
- 2. Health Awareness
- Woman body cycle and diseases
- Pregnancy
- Mid age problem
- Breast cancer

- "After attending your session on "Grief Cycle", I forbade my children from watching news at home, as I realized the impact of TV and watching violence."
- "Because of the change that our acquaintances and neighbours have seen in our behaviors, they now want to join the sessions themselves."
- "You gave me hope and turned my eyes toward God who has everything under control."
- A young Syrian lady who has been coached though our sessions decided to move on after having undergone a painful past. She declared that she wants to continue her studies in the Jordanian schools, in order to achieve her life-long dream of becoming a pharmacist.

Traumatized Syrian women will still be targeted through our Psychosocial Workshops. Aiming at a more specialized team, coaches will undergo training on how to handle Post-Traumatic Stress Release Sessions.

Staff is Worth the Investment

At ACCTS-AWT, we believe in the value of our employees and the necessity of equipping them for the work of the ministry. In 2014, The ACCTS-AWT staff had the opportunity to be developed spiritually, personally and professionally through different activities. Reverend Charlie Costa, Pastor of Ras Beirut Baptist Church in Beirut, Lebanon, lead our team in a series of nourishing devotions that built us up and increased our effectiveness in the workplace. The AWT team, along with a team from "Radio Alive" Lebanon and a team from Zarqa Baptist Church, received high standard training on social media. The training was held in March and conducted by Mr. Khaled El-Ahmad, Social Media Manager at @ZainJO | Founder of @DigiArabs.

2. Transformational Media Program

In July, one staff member and a volunteer were trained on shooting films and film-making through participating in the Transformational Media Program (TMP) training. The Program took place in Jordan and was administered by Regent University.

"Doors to the world opened in front of me!"

This is a quote from Blenda; a Networker from Iraq. And here is the story behind it.

Through AWT's 2013 Annual Network Conference, Blenda seized the opportunity and connected with Haggai Institute Regional Representative in the Middle East, who happened to be our main speaker at that year's Network Conference.

As a result of this networking, she arranged for him to visit Iraq and a great revival took place, one which saw its climax in the establishment of a branch of Haggai Institute in Iraq.

Blenda, who is now the Institute's coordinator in Iraq, didn't stop here. In our 2014 Network, she walked the extra mile by linking the AWT ministry with the Institute that she now represents, offering a chance for some of her fellow Networkers to be trained through Haggai Institute. Blenda who has been equipped for four years through AWT is now equipping servants on her own!

Secrets hidden in Syrian houses are different than what is being presented on the tables as problems:

Helpful Counseling, Life-Changing Impact

The Holy Spirit led one of the coaches to discover what was the reason behind a story that one of the Syrian ladies narrated. The coach said, "There is something obscure that I think is The THING that you need to share with me, not what you mentioned..." Here the whole story changed!

After following up through visits, the case that was first presented as a depression case that a Syrian lady's son was passing through, was finally exposed to the light! It was an illegal affair between the son and his uncle's wife.

The coach shared that this case is being followed up successfully, as a result of the great benefit she gained from the training she took with ACCTS on "Helpful Counseling Techniques". The coach who expressed how she felt dealing with this situation said, "I was silent and waited, which is a technique I learned through the training... This training changed our lives 180° and this is how it's impacting our Syrian sisters' lives!"

From a Victim to a Victor

A Syrian lady was suffering from continuous grief and anger toward life, the matter that caused physical diseases, such as high blood pressure, a neurological disease and stomach pains. Such conditions continued for years. Most of the time she wasn't able to get out of bed to perform her duties toward her family that consists of three girls and their father. She used to evade responsibility by staying asleep most of the time in order to hide her head in her bed and cry freely ... When she attended our first session she claimed that she is too hard on her daughters to a point of being unfair. After that she went back home, she embraced her three daughters who are 9, 7 and 5 years old.

At the second session, she shared how she feels toward her daughters and her husband. The coach talked to her about sadness and the existence of God and the importance of prayer and getting out of the grief cycle. When she learned about shock and grief, she promised that she would change all her behaviors.

In the last session she said, "I can now embrace my daughters, clean the house, talk with all my daughters and cook food."

She did almost all her duties and the greatest of all was that we heard her encouraging another Syrian lady to get out of the sadness and shock. Not to forget her healthy state of mind toward her daughters and her family.

 Arab women, especially with regards to our endeavor to utilize various forms of social media




ACCTS (AWT) is accountable to the following:

- 1. CHRISTAR is a mission organization that receives funds for ACCTS (AWT) projects and provides donors with receipts.



- 3. We feel it is very important to be transparent with our donors. All financial information is available upon request




Giving by Donor Category
