ACCTS-AWT History

ACCTS began in 2012 as an organization registered under the Ministry of Culture. However, that is only a small part of our beginning. Our organization started initially as a women's ministry called Arab Woman Today (AWT) in October 1999.

AWT began as a radio program to reach and encourage Arab women with the love of Jesus Christ. Ruba Abbassi, AWT's founder and manager, had a passion for reaching women outside the church walls. She was surrounded by women without hope, women who would never enter the doors of a church. Since then, AWT has been blessed to see its influence reach many Arabic-speaking nations.

Reemerging during COVID




women seeking **development**

This persona of Arab women is motivated by wrong beliefs about their abilities and potential. This problem leads them to avoid taking responsibility or recognizing their potential. They do not challenge mediocrity or become lifelong learners without a growth mindset. Even if they do desire to grow, these women may lack the resources, motivation, and network of support for growing and flourishing in life or their current profession.

2

women seeking **identity**

This persona of Arab women has a distorted image of themselves. They lack solid beliefs about themselves and their actual values. Being unaware makes them conform easily to the unhealthy opinions of others and the world around them. Living in a shame-based society with gender inequality and social injustice only exacerbates this problem. Many of these women wind up forming unhealthy relationships and patterns or doing things that go against their values.

3

women seeking **influence**

This persona of Arab women influences others consciously and unconsciously either by what they say or do or what they don't say or do. Many of these women are educated but lack the tools they need in their leadership roles or sphere of influence. Women who are equipped to be authentic leadership can be strong leaders who can guide other women well. This kind of empowerment creates a generation of women who genuinely support and strengthen each other.

4

women seeking **peace**

This persona of Arab women lives in turmoil and may not be at peace with herself or others. Many things rob them of their peace, such as overwhelming circumstances and challenges or past mistakes, sins, and failures. All of these things can lead to anxiety and a lack of security. Because of this lack of peace, women may have trouble managing their emotions, working through difficulties, and establishing healthy relationships.

Our Persona



Highlights from AWT programs and activities

“When women have confidence in themselves based on their God-given value, they can see the importance of their roles in the home and community. A culture that values women can promote equality and encourage women to make a difference and be a light in the world.”

Through the following programs, AWT held training, workshops, and webinars with women from North Africa and the Middle East attending. These women may reside inside or outside the MENA region.





1. Life Growth Program

154 participants reached



We firmly believe inner change can lead to a better, healthier society where women can flourish and have opportunities to hear life-changing truths. AWT's life-growth program seeks to nurture a growth mindset in women. It ignites their desire to pursue change and seek development by identifying their beliefs and values. This program helps women carefully choose priorities, set boundaries, and build healthier habits.

- **Nouara training**

The word Nouara means “blossom.” Nouara is a transformational training designed to equip women with the self-knowledge, tools, and skills they need to develop the untapped potential within them. Women study and work together using a program and curriculum specially designed for their spiritual, personal, and social growth.

- **Building Healthy Habits workshop**

This workshop helped women learn how to make healthy habits easy to adopt. It was based on the book Atomic Habits. Afterward, we created a challenge and created four group chats women could join based on the habit they wanted to adopt. These groups allowed them to support each other in building that habit.

262 women joined these four groups.

- **Journaling workshop**

A life skills blogger and podcaster led a workshop on writing and journaling. This workshop helped give women the tools needed to express themselves and their emotions through journaling and other forms of writing. They discussed 7 types of journaling and the importance of keeping journals as records to help track the growth and development in their lives.


2. Self-Discovery Program

27 participants

This program walks the women through a journey of self-discovery, addresses many aspects of their life stories, and helps raise their self-awareness. It equips them to realize their needs (inner-self) and improve their relationships (outer-self) while assisting them in understanding their emotions better.

- **Emotional Intelligence workshop**

This workshop helped women understand themselves and others. After this workshop, women were able to better understand their emotions and others for better self-confidence and improved relationships.



3. Leadership Program |

86 participants reached

“When women are empowered, the whole society benefits – not just the economy.”

AWT’s leadership program aims to provide Arab women leaders with the motivation, knowledge, and skills that would empower them to become more qualified as leaders and impact other women in their sphere of influence.



• Authentic Leadership training

In March, AWT hosted the Authentic Leadership training with women leaders from the Arab world. AWT developed content that helped encourage and equip women to become authentic leaders and make a difference. We provided women with tools to help them in their leadership journey. Women learned how to benefit from their life stories and to use their stories to become genuine leaders that depend on God's support and allow him to change and renew their lives.

• Communication Skills in the Workplace workshop


This workshop gave some strategies on how to deal with colleagues and others in the workplace. They were equipped to learn how to keep peace and improve or develop their relationships in their workplace.

• Your True North training

AWT held its first leadership training that served women in leadership positions outside the church walls. Your True North is a journey that helps women utilize their inner compass in authentic leadership. It focuses on five aspects: self-awareness, values, motivators, support teams, and the integrated life that helps them achieve fulfillment.

4. Healing Program

401 participants reached

The healing program provides women with a safe environment to open up, find refuge, and seek psychological assistance based on the truth. This program utilizes AWT team members, licensed counselors, and other volunteers to guide women on their journey to healing.



- How to Be Set Free From Feelings of Shame webinar

A local counselor consultant led a workshop that touched on the emotions of honor and shame that women feel, how to overcome stereotypes, and how to deal with these emotions to experience healing.

- Follow-up and counseling services

We provided **1101 hours** of follow-up and/or counseling for 306 women who connected with us online or through or various programs.

5. Motivational and Advocacy Program

It Is Not a Shame campaign

154 participants reached

In March, the AWT team launched a major campaign entitled "It Is Not a Shame." It included several social media components, Bible studies, and two live panels on this topic. Through this campaign, women learned the difference between guilt and shame and were able to experience healing from their past shame. 6. Economic Empowerment Program

40 participants reached

“Only 14% of women in Jordan actively participate in the workforce. That’s one out of every five women.”

This program gave women the needed tools to establish or advance in their careers. Through workshops or training, women identified their strengths and passions and were given much-needed guidance for pursuing careers within their passions.

- **Building Your Career Path training**

How to Build My Professional Future

Thirty-eight Arab women from seven countries participated in this specialized training to help them build a successful career path. It focused on topics like career planning and personal branding. This training gave women practical tools that can help them find a job or grow in their current profession.

- **Career consultation sessions**

Based on the needs of some women who participated in the career path training, AWT provided consultation sessions for women. These sessions allowed women to focus on specific needs they had in order to become established or to advance in their careers.

“Before the training, I was really lost. I couldn’t find anyone older than me to guide me on how to start my career. The training helped me develop communication skills, express my opinion, and discover myself.”

7. Comprehensive Christian Woman Growth Program

260 participants reached

“Spiritually speaking, women who recognize that Jesus has taken their shame upon himself become healthier leaders. They can make a lasting difference in their church and community.”

For women to experience significant growth in their Christian walk and work with God to expand the kingdom, they need to learn to center their mind, heart, body, and soul around God. They need to be restored by His love, mercy, and grace. AWT believes women themselves are the most critical catalysts for change in their own lives, other women’s lives, the church, and society accordingly.

Through this comprehensive program for Christian women, AWT focuses on how a solid identity in Christ changes one’s personal and social precepts of themselves and others. AWT disciples, empowers, and equips women with the knowledge, healthy thinking patterns, and methods they need to grow in self-confidence, unlock their God-given potential, and break down barriers to being active members in the body of Christ.

- **Bible Studies**


These inductive Bible studies taught women how to read and analyze Scripture and apply it to their lives. These Bible studies focused on women’s identity in Christ, healing, and restoration. Many women came away from these Bible studies with new-found knowledge and a better foundation for studying the Bible.

- **Identity workshop**

One of the AWT team members spoke about identity to groups of females. She emphasized the importance of having the correct image of our identity to understand our capabilities, behaviors, and values.

- **Walk Thru the Bible workshops**

AWT hosted our first Walk Thru the Bible workshops in Arabic. These two workshops provided a grand overview of significant Old and New Testament themes, events, people, and chronology.

From Admirer to Ambassador: Youstina's Journey

- Youstina's story with Arab Woman Today (AWT) began through the Balshi Min Hon Facebook page in March 2020 at the beginning of the pandemic when the department's programs had to switch to an online format. She first participated with us in "The Tree of Roles" training, then joined us in the Nourara program later in 2020. This training significantly impacted her, especially with her love for writing and communicating with people through her job as a radio host. She then participated in most of our Facebook campaigns and awareness programs.

- Youstina's story didn't stop here; she went on to be one of the first candidates to participate in the 2021 Authentic Leadership Training. She showed great interest and commitment, and she demonstrated a deep passion for learning and development. From here, her relationship with the AWT team deepened to a more personal level, creating a sense of belonging. Youstina shared a video recording with us as an ambassador among her audience. In this short video, she spoke about her experience in the Nouara 2020 training. She encouraged many people by sharing her belief in the programs and the benefits women will receive from them. She also insisted on participating in the Nouara training when its new version developed in 2021.

- At AWT, we do not only provide training and access to beneficial workshops. We also seek to empower and support the participants in all possible ways. We provide a platform for them to share their progress as we walk this journey with them as part of their development. After seeing her growth, the team offered Youstina a special invitation to volunteer with us. She received training through the first life-growth program to be a team leader and facilitator.

- This invitation left a great impression on Youstina, which added to her enthusiasm to be an ambassador for AWT. Youstina is a shining example of a woman who moved from simply visiting our page and programs to becoming an outstanding ambassador.



Moving Past Her Shame

Rebecca* (not her real name) lives in a place heavily controlled by a major terrorist organization. Since she was a child, family members sexually abused her. Even though she is well-educated and has a good job as a dentist, she feels as if she has nothing. At one point, her father was taking all her salary, and she saw herself as no more than a servant in her own house. She couldn't differentiate guilt from the deep sense of shame she felt from her abuse. More than once, Rebecca contemplated taking her own life.

Last year, after coming across Arab Woman Today's campaign "It Is Not a Shame," she reached out to an AWT team member. "Can you explain to me the difference between guilt and shame?" she asked. This AWT team member explained the difference to Rebecca, who then understood things more clearly.

"Thank you!" Rebecca exclaimed. "Now I know why I mixed up guilt and shame."

This AWT team member reaffirmed to Rebecca God's love for her and her value in his eyes. With some time, Rebecca began to get rid of her feelings of shame from her abuse. She was able to stand up to her father in order to keep half of her salary. Not too long ago, Rebecca moved into a dormitory near her dental practice, where she finds respite during the workweek from her abusive family. An AWT team member regularly keeps in touch with Rebecca, often sending her encouraging messages. It usually isn't long before she responds back and shares her current struggles. Each message and phone call is like medicine for her bones. "I'm on a journey toward healing," she recently shared.

We are glad women like Rebecca heard the truth about honor and shame in a way that is bringing healing to their hearts and lives.

Highlights from the Youth Department

322 Participants

322 participants participated in various activities and programs.

51 Training sessions

ACCTS Youth Department provided 51 different training sessions and workshops via face-to-face and online format

18 Young men and women

18 young men and women submitted their applications to join the volunteer committee. After we have trained them over the past four years, they have become advocates.

400 Publications and videos

Content and writing produced more than 400 publications and videos for the program's social media platforms and training, whether online or in person.

85 Videos

85 devotional, educational, and motivational videos were produced and shared through different social media platforms.



Celebrating a Milestone: First Graduating Group

In June of 2021, the first group of youth to begin with the ACCTS youth department graduated. We spent the last four years learning and growing together. Because we firmly believe that everyone has a role in changing their society, we prepared essential material that incorporated the speakers who partnered with us through the previous years. Our goal is to continue guiding this graduated group of youth in influencing other people with what they have learned from us.

Conferences and workshops

ACCTS presented motivational sessions on the influence of a mustard seed and shared the difference between leaders and influencers..

We introduced Jordanian youth to initiatives and ministries during our journey with them in 2021. They had the chance to meet some government officials, political figures, and parliament members from Jordan and the Netherlands who shared concerns about youth development. The youth also learned about the European Union.

In one session, we gave one youth a chance to share about a project he had launched. His passion drove him to utilize his talents in film production to serve the community by highlighting and reflecting on reality and the needs he saw. He launched several videos raising awareness on social issues, showing himself to be an example of a good citizen concerned about his society.

Jordanian youth also partook in panel discussions where they openly shared their challenges and questions and listened to answers from those in authority and decision-making positions.

A New Journey With a New Group

The beginning of a new journey - September and October

We reached two new groups through two training opportunities. The lectures aimed to raise awareness among young people on several different topics to deal with their challenges, whether in their personal or professional lives. We highlighted the importance of contributing to their influencing and leadership skills during the training. Enhancing their roles, discovering and building on the talents that God has put in them, and knowing their role serve as a basis for constructive change. We trained them to develop their abilities to have sound scientific and personal views. The youth participated in an interactive session to learn the importance of practical and effective social media platforms and dealing with them adequately.

Annual Youth Conference

Christianity in a Time of Crisis

The ACCTS youth department held its annual conference for young Jordanians in late October. The conference enabled young people to know their identity and values and give them tools to help them discover their personalities and figure out their calling. It also sought to empower young people to deal with crises through three primary sources: thought, spirit, and skills.

- Youth Participation in Political Life
- The Definition of Identity
- Values and Characteristics
- The Importance of My Engagement with Society and Politics

The annual conference was followed by a panel discussion featuring a former member of parliament, Mr. Kais Zayadin. We broadcasted the panel on the ACCTS Youth social media platforms and had over 68,000 views. Another participant, Danny Twal, shared his life experience with the other participants. The personal and professional challenges he faced and how he overcame them inspired other young people to see their situation differently.

Connecting Youth Through Different Channels

We reached about 128 young men and women through four WhatsApp groups and provided them with different materials, sources, and videos to strengthen, inspire, and motivate them throughout the year. Videos covered various topics from several angles to helping young people restore their relationship with God after almost two years of abnormal circumstances because of the pandemic. Through our interaction with them, they shared their encouragement to trust God in whatever situation they face. We sent weekly videos that included different topics such as leadership, values, influence, and more.



Social Media

The ACCTS youth department launched two new social media platforms in July 2021, one on Facebook and one on Instagram by the name, Zawiyeh Thaniyeh, or "Another Angle." We aspire to encourage integrated thinking that combines good values and effective productivity among young people on these pages. We want to provide a platform that enables Jordanian youth to develop their skills, build on correct information, and form intellectual capabilities that guide them in the right direction.

The Youth Initiative filmed and shared many videos to strengthen, inspire, and motivate one hundred youth throughout the year. Videos covered different topics from several angles to help young people restore their relationship with God after almost two years of abnormal circumstances. They provided encouragement for the youth to trust God in whatever they face.




Income by Partner Type
